













## Message from the Chairpersons of the Fundraising Committee



Dear Alumni and Friends,

We're excited to share some good news about last year's Annual Fundraiser! Thanks to the generosity of our community, we were able to raise an incredible ₱8,275,593.57. Special thanks to the RSA Foundation, ICTSI Foundation, Inc., and the Francis & Chit Jardeleza Foundation, each of whom gave ₱2,000,000 to help get things started. We're also deeply grateful to our UP alumni and friends, who came together to contribute a remarkable ₱2.2 million.

These funds made a real difference. Just over half (53.02%) was dedicated to the electrification project at the UPV City campus, tackling an urgent infrastructure need. Another ₱855,000 went to support the school's daily operations, helping students take part in both local and international conferences, run events, and solve everyday school challenges. We used ₱837,099 to upgrade our school facilities, and set aside ₱130,000 for scholarships and food allowances for ten students. Our faculty and staff were able to benefit from a healthcare coverage, with ₱423,365 going to HMO support. We also earmarked ₱150,000 for the yearbook of the graduating class of 2025.

This year, we're excited to welcome Class 1986 led by Marie Karen Jiz, Jere Cejar, Rovea Onglatco, and Marigold Milliam as the new leaders of our Fundraising Committee for the next two years. We are delighted to have them onboard as we embark on improving and delivering more meaningful projects for UPHSI.

For 2025, our Annual Fundraiser will roll out in two parts. The first phase, happening from July to December, focuses on class and individual donations from alumni. In the second phase, we'll cap things off with a Mardi Gras event on March 27, 2026. This gathering is a chance to bring together friends and fellow alumni for a purposeful celebration.

Looking forward, we're committed to building more programs by working closely with local and national officials. We are hopeful that this will truly benefit UPHSI and the UP Visayas community. With your ongoing support, we know we can achieve even more.

Thank you for the trust and for believing in what we can do together as a community.

The primary objective is to extend unrestricted financial assistance and support to the students and faculty of UPHSI, ensuring they have access to necessary resources and opportunities.

Launched on May 28, 2024, the fundraiser started with an initial ₱3,000,000.00 seed fund from the Francis and Chit Jardeleza Foundation, RSA Foundation, and the ICTSI Foundation Inc.

The UPHSI Annual Fundraiser successfully raised more than 6.5 million during the Alumni Homecoming held on August 17, 2024.

The ceremonial turnover of this amount took place at the UPV Auditorium of the city campus, where the check was received by UPHSI principal Prof. Edelia Braga. Present during the event were representatives of UPIC HS Class '65, UPHSI Class 2024, and the current student council members.









#### **HANDUMANAN PROJECT**



The Handumanan Project is a response to the need to protect structures of heritage value in the UPV Iloilo City campus.

The Old High School Building, originally called the Home Economics (HE) Building and the Women's Club are iconic buildings that reflect postwar architecture – American Tsalet - that was prevalent in Iloilo during the reconstruction period. The one-story buildings are an amalgamation of Filipino and colonial architecture. These structures are part of the larger history of the city on the one hand, and the internal history of the university on the other.





On June 5, 2023, a groundbreaking event was held to initiate the renovation of two buildings. The ceremony was attended by former Senate President Franklin Drilon and retired Supreme Court Associate Justice Francis Jardeleza, both who played key roles in the renovation efforts.

The renovation funding was sourced from the General Appropriations Act (GAA) 2022, which Sen. Drilon prioritized during his final term in the Senate.

Additionally, funds for the assessment were gathered from Justice Jardeleza, the UPIC HS class of 1965, and the GAA 2021, which supported the development of UPV's Land Use Development and Infrastructure Plan (LUDIP), managed by the OVCPD.


Moreover, the publication of the *Padayon nga Maragtas sang UP sa Visayas* in 2022, served also to provide supplemental funds to the project.





Padayon, UP High! Celebrating the Legacy of UP High School in Iloilo is a coffee table book project that features personal stories from alumni and faculty members spanning generations, alongside archival and contemporary photographs, highlighting the school's significant achievements and memorable moments.

This memorabilia offers a glimpse into the shared experiences of a high school community built on the foundation of honor and excellence.

Proceeds from the book will contribute to the funds of the Friends of UP Visayas High School Foundation, Inc., supporting the needs of its students and faculty members.

#### **GRACIANO LOPEZ JAENA BIOGRAPHY PROJECT**



Unlike José Rizal and other Philippine heroes, many of whom were part of the principalia, far fewer works have focused on Graciano López Jaena, the llonggo writer, orator, and patriot. While some historians and writers have celebrated their preferred heroes, López Jaena has often been criticized and marginalized. José Alejandrino once described him as "slovenly," recalling an incident where López Jaena ate sardines with his fingers and wiped them on his already dirty suit. National Artist Nick Joaquin called him "an outsider not only to the colony but also to our history," claiming he had distanced himself from the Propaganda Movement.

National Artist Resil Mojares similarly portrayed him as "impecunious and ambitious," dying "embittered and obscure" in Spain. The last biography on López Jaena was published in 1964 by the late Demy Sonza, underscoring the lack of recent scholarly attention on his legacy.

The Graciano López Jaena Biography
Project seeks to challenge these criticisms
and reestablish López Jaena as a central
figure in the Philippine independence
movement, alongside José Rizal and
Marcelo del Pilar, forming the original
Philippine triumvirate.

Thus far, research has revealed that, unlike other \*ilustrados\*, López Jaena came from a relatively poor family that was unable to provide him with regular financial support during his time in Spain. Much of the criticism against him can be traced to this financial hardship, as he was often preoccupied with meeting his basic needs, in contrast to his wealthier peers. Additionally, it has been confirmed that López Jaena studied Medicine at the Universidad Central de Madrid after transferring from the Universidad Literaria de Valencia. It has also come to light that he later enrolled in the Law School at the same university.

These findings underscore López Jaena's intellectual ambition and his desire to contribute to society not only as a writer but also as a professional. Furthermore, new research reveals that López Jaena did not die of tuberculosis in a hospital, as commonly believed, but rather of arteriosclerosis, alone in his apartment. This discovery significantly revises the accepted narrative of his final days and provides a more nuanced understanding of his legacy.

#### **GRACIANO LOPEZ JAENA BIOGRAPHY PROJECT**

The project has gathered materials from various archives, including the National Library, National Archives, UP Diliman Library, Ateneo de Manila Library, and Filipinas Heritage Library. Unpublished documents from the Universidad de Valencia and the Archivo Histórico Nacional in Spain have also been retrieved.

Emmanuel Lerona's trip to Spain has uncovered additional primary sources, further illuminating López Jaena's significant role in the fight for the Philippine nation and, eventually, independence.







Emmanuel Lerona is a multidisciplinary creative whose works span film, cultural research, and education. He wrote and directed *Sa Taguangkan sang Duta* (2024) and the documentary *Pátok* (The Mountain Carvers) (2019). A collaborator in numerous Western Visayan film projects, he also explores local languages, indigenous communities, and history. He is currently finishing the biography of Graciano Lopez Jaena. He also designed a coffee table book on photographer Felix Laureano. Lerona is a graduate of UP High School Class of 1999.

#### **PAG-ULIKID: NO STUDENT LEFT BEHIND PROJECT**

The No Student Left Behind is an assistance program that supports deserving and in-need students of UP High School in Iloilo by providing a Php 20,000 annual allowance. This initiative aims to alleviate the financial challenges students face, enabling them to focus on their academic and personal growth.

Additionally, this project will grant a monthly food allowance to a number of students. This initiative is inspired by the efforts of Class 1983 under the leadership of Atty. Nellie Jo Aujero Regalado. Through this program, students who are in need are provided with their most basic needs.

Last year, the foundation provided Php130,000 which covered one semester of food and cash allowance to ten students of the UP High School. In the upcoming school year, another set of students are going to be granted this scholarship.



#### **UPV CITY CAMPUS ELECTRIFCATION PROJECT**

In partnership with MORE Electric and Power Corporation, this project provided additional electrification not only to the new high school building but as well as the other buildings affected by the lack of power capacity provided by the current power source in the city campus. With a total cost of around 4,252,669.13 pesos, wherein 971,694.57 pesos was generously donated by MORE Power, this initiative addresses the urgent need for a more conducive learning and working environment for the high school students, faculty members, and staff.

By addressing the shortage in electrical capacity in the campus, this project enabled the installation of much-needed air conditioning units and other electronic equipment in the high school buildings. This is also beneficial for future structural projects that will be requiring more power supply.

The project covered the labor and materials for the installation of the new electric service connection, the main distribution panel, and the electrical wiring in the new high school building.

Less than a year since the project was launched, the UP High School, as well as its neighboring buildings, is now ready to be energized as needed.

#### **UPHSI OPERATING NEEDS AND EXPENSES**

### **OVERVIEW OF THE PROJECT**

Allocating at least 855,000 pesos for the school year 2024-2025, this fund addresses the evolving needs of UPHSI. With the guidance of the high school principal, assigned committee members, and the members of the alumni community, appropriation of funds are allocated to various activities, conferences, and other emerging needs of the high school throughout the school year.

A portion of the funds has been utilized through a diverse range of activities, including the UPHSI Open House, Student Council projects, and research conferences in Baguio, Malaysia, Singapore, and Japan.

Moreover, this added assistance for the Faculty Development Fund for a research paper presentation in Thailand. Other activities that were able to tap into this fund are Pahampang 2024, CAS Week 2024, RCY summer camp, rifles for the UPHSI Colors, food assistance for the Christmas Party, and snacks for enrollment volunteers.

## UPHSI STEM STUDENTS' ACHIEVEMENTS AT RESEARCH CONFERENCES

Students from the University of the Philippines High School in Iloilo (UPHSI) STEM strand showcased their research excellence at multiple prestigious research conferences, with significant support from the Friends of UP Visayas High School Foundation, Inc.

Science Castle Singapore 2025. Two UPHSI teams presented their innovative research in this international event after its five-year hiatus. Team MuntingSilicons explored the anti-angiogenic potential of Muntingia calabura flavonoids, while Team Hydrofabs developed chitin-integrated cotton fabrics.

#### Science Castle Asia 2024, Malaysia.

Three UPHSI teams participated among competitors from nine countries, winning medals and special awards. One team earned a gold medal and the Ajinomoto Poster award, while another was recognized with the Focus System Special Award and a trip to Japan.

Alchemes 2025 at UP Diliman. Competing for the first time in Alchemes Golconda, UPHSI had two teams secure Top 20 spots among 193 entries. Their projects focused on natural oil adsorption and coconut oil refinement using eco-friendly materials.

Science Castle Philippines 2025. A group of UPHSI students earned recognition with the Special Poster Award for their study on Muntingia calabura flavonoids at the inaugural Science Castle Philippines hosted by Ateneo de Manila University.

Students from the University of the Philippines High School in Iloilo (UPHSI) STEM strand showcased their research excellence at multiple prestigious research conferences, with significant support from the Friends of UP Visayas High School Foundation, Inc.

#### National Biotechnology Week 2024, UPLB. UPHSI teams excelled in a national quiz competition, winning 2nd Runner-Up, and had two research teams make it to the Top 20 for their studies on anti-angiogenic

#### Science Castle Osaka Kansai 2024.

Select UPHSI students presented six research studies as global guests in Japan, covering diverse topics like sunscreen creams from calabash extract, microplastics in fish, and cellulose aerogels for insulation.

## INSTALLATION OF NEW AIRCONDITIONERS

To provide a better learning environment, the Foundation donated four 3-tonner air conditioners and one split-type unit to be used in UP High School classrooms and the newly renovated faculty rooms. The dance studio also got new speakers, costing ₱58,999. The total spent on this project was ₱837,099, ensuring students have more comfortable and engaging spaces to study and create.





### **UPHSI FACULTY AND STAFF WELLNESS PROJECT**



This project provided health insurance coverage to tenured faculty members and staff of UPHSI, ensuring they have reliable healthcare assistance when needed. In 2024, the foundation allocated ₱18,407.20 per employee, totaling to around ₱423,365.60.

Through Aon's Benefits Care Program, each member is entitled to ₱200,000.00 coverage in major hospitals nationwide under PhilCare. This also includes free dental services.

The foundation is looking forward to sustain this program in order to ensure that faculty members and other personnel of the high school department are covered annually.

## SUPPORT FOR GRADUATING STUDENTS


